Health and Wellness – Tricia Heary



The Health and Wellness Department has planned two free programs for the Fall to be held at the Haddon Fortnightly.

The Matter of Balance - Falls Prevention Program is being held on Mondays and Wednesdays from 2;00PM to 4:00PM. Matter of Balance (MOB) is specifically designed to reduce the fear of falling and improve activity levels among community-dwelling older adults. The program includes eight two-hour classes presented and led by trained coaches. The program enables participants to reduce the fear of falling by learning to view falls as controllable, setting goals for increasing activity levels, making small changes to reduce fall risks at home, and exercise to increase strength and balance.

The curriculum includes group discussions, mutual problem solving, role-play activities, exercise training, assertiveness training, and a few homework assignments.

Participants learn about the importance of exercise in preventing falls and practice exercises to improve strength, coordination, and balance. Participants also conduct a home safety evaluation and learn to get up and down safely.

Certified trainers from the Camden County Department of Health and Human Services will be covering the following components:

- How to Question, Persuade and Refer someone who may be suicidal
- How to get help for yourself or learn more about preventing suicide
- The common causes of suicidal behavior
- The warning signs of suicide
- How to get help for someone in crisis
- Resources and booklets will also be provided.

Who is this training for?

Anyone who is in a position to recognize that someone may be contemplating suicide: parents, friends, teachers, coaches and many others.

- How to get help for yourself or learn more about preventing suicide.
- The common causes of suicidal behavior.
- The warning signs of suicide.
- How to get help for someone in crisis.

NJSFWC STATE FALL CONFERENCE

SPECIAL STATE PROJECT COLLECTION



New Jersey Children's Alliance promotes hope, healing and justice for victims of child abuse throughout New Jersey by supporting Child Advocacy Centers (CAC) with training, resources, advocacy, and leadership. The CACs are child-friendly centers where a multidisciplinary team (MDT) consisting of Department of Children and Families workers, police, prosecutors, victim advocates, medical and mental health professionals meet to coordinate a response to allegations of child sexual and severe physical abuse. There is a CAC in every county.

With the CAC model, a child discloses, or when abuse is suspected, the child is brought to the CAC, a child-friendly facility, where they are interviewed by a specially trained forensic interviewer. The professionals involved in the investigation can view the interview in monitoring rooms, with the goal of eliminating the need to re-interview the child. The team members share case information with one another and determine next steps. The family is then connected with needed services that promote healing, including medical and mental health care. The centers are in need of QUIET items for children waiting for services.

At NJSFWC's State Fall Conference, our members and clubs are asked to bring the following items that will be given to children when they come to the center to help with the waiting process. Please help with this project by donating the following items:

- Small boxes of crayons
- Small boxes of colored pencils
- Small stuffed animals that children can hold in their hands (for younger children needing comfort)
- Small pads of paper or notebooks (should be bounded no loose paper)
- Pencils
- Small bottles of hand sanitizers
- Pocket tissues (the types that can be put into a purse or pocket)

Please Note: All items should be small and should not make any noise while the children waiting for services. These items will be distributed to all the Child Advocacy Centers throughout New Jersey.
