Bylaws Committee Report

The Bylaws Committee is recommending a few changes to the Bylaws. The proposed changes relate to the follow issues:

- 1. The Committee is recommending that the due date for payment of members' dues be changed from April 1 to March 1. This change will assure that we will have dues collections on hand to satisfy NJSFWC's new requirement that member clubs pay their dues on May 1 when they submit their "Blue Sheet" showing their membership count.
- 2. Currently the First VP receives the annual dues payment with the membership renewal form. The First VP must log all the checks before turning them over to the Treasurer, who also must log the checks before depositing them. To streamline this, the Bylaws Committee recommends that the dues payments and the membership renewal forms be sent to the P.O. Box, where the Treasurer would pick them up. She would log and deposit the annual dues checks as she does with any checks that come in. She would turn the membership forms over to the First VP for use in preparing the yearbook, and she would notify the Membership Chairman if there were any changes in membership.

In order to address these issues, the Bylaws Committee is recommending modifications to three sections of our Bylaws. These modifications are described on the attached sheet titled "**Proposed Bylaws Revisions** – **January 2025**". Please review these modifications before the January Business Meeting and then print out and bring a copy of the attached sheet to the January Business Meeting with you.

The Bylaws Committee will review the proposed modifications at the January Business Meeting and will answer any questions that you may have. The members present at that meeting will then be asked to approve the proposed bylaw changes as presented, effective immediately.

Cold Weather Safety Tips from the Weather Channel

To avoid frostbite and hypothermia:

- **∼**Wear layers of loose-fitting, lightweight, warm clothing.
- ❤️Wear a hat. Try to stay dry and out of the wind.
- **Cover your mouth to protect your lungs from extreme cold.**
- **∼**Mittens, snug at the wrist, are better than gloves.

Vehicle Preparation:

- **Check your battery**
- **Check your fluids**
- **Check your tires**
- **∼** Have jumper cables
- **≪**Pack a blanket

To avoid carbon monoxide poisoning, a silent, deadly killer claiming about 1,000 lives each year in the United States:

- **♥**Install a carbon monoxide detector.
- **≪**NEVER run generators indoors.
- **♥**Open a window slightly when using a kerosene heater and follow the manufacturer's instructions.
- **≪**NEVER use a gas oven to heat your home.
- **≪**If your heat goes out, you can keep warm indoors by closing off rooms you do not need, dressing in layers of lightweight clothing, and wearing a cap.

Civic Engagement and Outreach - Cathy Jenkins

Haddon Fortnightly Partnership with High Schoolers

Are young women in high school more concerned about making TikTok videos, posting on Instagram, communicating on SnapChat? Not the young women at Haddonfield Memorial High School's Women in Need Club!

These young women approached the Dean of Students inquiring how they could get menstrual supplies to the young women in Camden City. The Dean of Students, who just happened to be my son, Dr. Hamisi Tarrant, asked me for advice. I told him that our Civic Engagement and Outreach Department had just begun an initiative to work with the Camden High School Campus Nurses to supply the students with menstrual supplies.

I met with the young women in the Women In Need Club along with their advisor, Ms. Bannet. I was so impressed with the maturity and social consciousness of the students. When they made the statement, "They are us." It made me realize that these young women identified with the young women in Camden City, they knew that it was only geography and circumstances that separated them.

The Women In Need Club collected three shopping bags full of supplies to donate to the young women on Camden High School's Campus that houses four high schools. These supplies were delivered to the campus just before the winter break. The nurses at the campus relayed that the supplies were very much needed and appreciated.

Proposed Bylaws Revisions – January 2025:

1. Article IV (Dues), Section 1 The annual dues shall be recommended by the Finance Committee to the Executive Board to be approved by the General Membership. They shall be payable April 1st. To be listed in the Club yearbook, dues must be received no later than May 1st. If a member's dues remain unpaid by June 1st, she shall be notified by the Membership Chairman that unless her dues are paid within 30 days of receipt of notification, she shall be dropped from membership.

CHANGE: 2nd sentence, REPLACE April 1 WITH March 1

TO READ: They shall be payable March 1st.

RATIONALE: To ensure that funds will be available to pay the NJSFWC Dues on May 1.

2. Article VI (Duties of Officers), Section 2(A) (The First Vice-President) – The First Vice-President shall serve as Chairman of the Yearbook Committee. She shall accept membership renewal documentation, passing dues payments along to the Treasurer and sharing information collected with relevant members of the Board.

CHANGE: DELETE entire second sentence

TO READ: 2A The First Vice-President shall serve as Chairman of the Yearbook

Committee.

RATIONALE: Clarification and to streamline dues collection by moving it to the Treasurer.

3. Article VI (Duties of Officers), Section 6 The Treasurer shall sign checks and pay all bills for budgeted items and any bills properly verified by persons incurring the indebtedness and approved by the President. She shall render a financial statement monthly and give an annual report in May. She shall be custodian of all bank accounts, securities and legal papers belonging to the Club. She shall be Chairman of the Finance Committee.

CHANGE: ADD at end of Section 6 "The Treasurer shall collect the annual dues. She shall notify the Membership Chairman of any changes due to payment or non-payment of dues."

TO READ: The Treasurer shall sign checks and pay all bills for budgeted items and any bills properly verified by persons incurring the indebtedness and approved by the President. She shall render a financial statement monthly and give an annual report in May. She shall be custodian of all bank accounts, securities and legal papers belonging to the Club. She shall be Chairman of the Finance Committee. The Treasurer shall collect the annual dues. She shall notify the Membership Chairman of any changes due to payment or non-payment of dues.

RATIONALE: To add dues to the Treasurer.

The members will be asked to approve the proposed bylaw changes as presented, effective immediately.


